Best Apps

1. 1Password (free). Store all password in one place (iPhone, desktop and iPad). You simply have to remember one password

2. Lumosity (iPhone) – Free

Keep your mind sharp with some of the best mind games around, designed by neuroscientists working to enhance memory, attention and other skills.

3. FlipBoard (iPhone & iPad – Free)

This is the greatest invention since the invention of social media! Connect this app with all of your social media accounts, and connect it with some of the best news and content sites that interest you. Then watch it turn everything into a digital magazine, in which you “flip” the pages and see everything set up like a magazine, including Facebook posts and tweets.

4. Park N Forget (iPhone -.99 cents)

Parking lots can be confusing, and trying to locate your car among hundreds of other vehicles frustrates even the most patient driver, young or old. Park ‘n’ Forget helps you remember where you parked your car and even monitors the amount of time spent in metered parking spots. When leaving your car in a parking deck, pick the color or number associated with the deck level to pinpoint your location

iPhone / iPad Tips

Take a screenshot

Press the Home and Sleep/Wake buttons at the same time. The picture is saved to the Screenshots album in Photos.

Quickly open the camera

When iPhone is locked, swipe left to access the camera.

Find it Fast

Search your iPhone, the Internet, nearby places, the weather, and more — from anywhere on your iPhone. Just swipe down from the top of the screen to show Search.

Notification

To be notified when someone replies to a mail message or thread, tap the Mark button, then tap Notify Me.



Magnifier

Go to Settings > General > Accessibility and turn on Magnifier. Then triple-click the Home button to use the camera to zoom in on small details. Tap



the Filter button to enhance the image. Tap the shutter to freeze it.

PDF anything

You can save almost anything as a PDF. Tap the Action button, then tap Print. Pinch the first page of the preview, then tap



the Action button  to save or send the document.
